Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Louisa and Samuel Burton came west with the Heber C. Kimball Company in 1848. 662 individuals were in the company when it began its journey from the outfitting post at Winter Quarters, Nebraska.

Ira Smith died in 1843. Louisa married Samuel Burton in Winter Quarters. Samuel died in Suttersville, Sacramento, California in 1852—probably in the gold fields.

Louisa married Dixon Oliver in 1852 in Sacramento, California.

Louisa was living with her daughter in Cottage Grove, Lane, Oregon at the time of her death in 1904.
