Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Thomas came with the Brigham Young Company. Left from the Platte River on April 16, 1847 and arrived July 21, 1847. In 1848 Thomas returned for his family and they all traveled in the Brigham Young Company which left Winter Quarters June 5, 1848 and arrived Sep. 20-24, 1848.

-Henrietta Rushton was Thomas' first wife together they had Thomas Henry, Charles Richard, Pamela, and Willard Richards. Thomas married Lucy Caroline Clayton in 1843 in Nauvoo, Illinois and in 1852 also married Betsy Prudence Howard. Thomas' wife Lucy gave birth at Winter Quarters to Mary Catherine.
