-Lewis was mustered as a private in Company C of the Mormon Battalion but died before he could march with them. (Members of the Mormon Battalion. Susan W. Easton, Roster of Mormon Battalion, emailed source),

-He was married to Anna Caroline Overton, but they either separated or divorced.

-Apostle Willard Richards's journal talks about the separation on January 3, 1847. "Lewis Hulse and wife appeared to answer a charge of the marshal for disturbing the peace of the camp. The marshal brought the parties before the council . . . Council decided they should separate, and live together no more as husband and wife, unless by revelation. Marshall and bishop to divide the

property." (Mormon Church History: A detailed chronology of Mormon History. Mormon History, Sunday, Jan 3, 1847)

-Lewis had been sick several weeks before his death. In Isaac Clark's 1847 record book he recorded giving: March 4- one lb. of coffee one of sugar, six of flour; March 11- to Dr. Bradley 30 cts in wood for attendance on Lewis Hulse; March 12- To Asa Lyman one bushel of meal for the support of Lewis Hulse; March 15- To Lewis Hulse one pint of whiskey and brimstone; March 20- one pint of molasses to Hulse; March 21- George A. Smith Cr. By 25 cts for the burial of Lewis Hulse. -The above record suggests that Lewis did not have family at Winter Quarters with him since the bishop was paying people to care for him.
