Which Winter Quarters Ward or Iowa Branch was the family: unknown

Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? George Washington, age 17, and Oliver, age 22, were living with Brigham Young and his wife Mary Ann in Great Salt Lake house #94. Hulda was living with family members, James and Hulda Duncan, in Davis County, UT house #118, pg. 10.

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? George Washington and Hulda came in the Heber C. Kimball Co. which left Winter Quarters June 7, 1848 and arrived Sep. 24, 1848. Oliver at age 11 and William Pekin age 7 traveled with the Brigham Young Company which left Winter Quarters June 5, 1848 and arrived Sep. 20-24, 1848.

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

-Mary and William were married Feb. 13, 1831.

-Together they had James, George Washington, James H., Oliver Hazard Perry, William Pekin, and Hulda Caroline. (<http://findagrave.com/cgi-bin/fg.cgi?page=gr&GRid=35005102>)

-William died in Omaha Douglas County, Nebraska on Jan. 22, 1847, less than 2 months after the death of his wife. (<http://findagrave.com/cgi-bin/fg.cgi?page=gr&GRid=35005102>)

-George Washington Duncan moved to California. In 1870 he lived in Tule River, CA and was raising stock with his brother William (with his wife and 4 children) (U.S. Census, California, 1870, p. 271.)

-In 1860 George and Oliver are living in Tulare, CA Township 2 and working as farmers. (U.S. Census 1860, Tulare, CA, house # 152 and 153, p.21, (listed as George Dunkin).) At age 77 in 1910 George was still working as a self-employed poultry farmer. (U.S. Census 1910, Eden CA, house #12)

-Oliver shows up in El Dorado, California by 1852 at age 15. (U.S. Census 1852, California, p.5). In 1880 Oliver is married and has 8 children while living in Tule River, Tulare, CA (U.S. Census 1880, California, house #83).

-Oliver lived with Brigham Young for one year before heading to California because he broke his thigh while crossing the plains. -Hulda C married George Naylor from England and lived in Utah until her death in 1921. Together she and George had 7 sons and 2 daughters. ("Utah, Salt Lake County Death Records, 1849-1949," database with images, *FamilySearch*) Her husband George was called to serve as a member of the quorum of the 70. He built the first wagon in Utah.
