Which Winter Quarters Ward or Iowa Branch was the family: Unknown

Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? John Spicer, born December 4, 1816 in Springport, Cayuga, New York, died in Garden Grove on March 3, 1847 in Decatur, Iowa.

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Evidence from census and genealogical records proves that Naomi and Mortimer Spicer traveled to Utah by 1850. They were the niece and nephew of Joseph and Diana France, and probably traveled with them in the 1849 Samuel Gully/Orson Spencer Company. Both Mortimer and Naomi appear in the France household in the 1850 Utah census (they are listed as Mortimer "France" (age 8) and "Momi France" (age 6).
