Which Winter Quarters Ward or Iowa Branch was the family: William was in the 5th Ward with his mother, father, and siblings.

Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? In Great Salt Lake county, house #567, p.107. William age 24 (indexed incorrectly as 10), Adelia (indexed as Amelia) age 25, Maria age 3, William age 1, Delecta age 55, and Samuel Smith age 13.

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? The Brigham Young Company which left Winter Quarters June 5, 1848 and arrived Sep 20-24.

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

-William was born in Ontario, New York. (Nauvoo Endowment Temple Register) He was born Feb. 21, 1827 which means he was only 19 when his daughter died. (Winter Quarters website, 5th ward)

-Adelia Clark was William's first wife followed by Martha Granger, Elia Atkinson, and Sarah Ann Sanderson. (70's Record, emailed to me)

-Delinea was the first child born to this couple, followed by: Maria Adelia Young born Feb. 29, 1847, William Wallace born Feb. 28, 1850, Joseph Gardner born Feb. 15, 1852, Lorenzo Dow III born March 24, 1854, and Marina Eliza born Aug. 28, 1858. (Family Group Sheet)

-William was baptized in the spring of 1835, when he was 8 (Family Group Sheet, email)

-Adelia's mother, Delecta Clark age 55 from Vermont, was living with the family during the 1850 U.S. Census in Great Salt Lake County. William was working as a laborer at this time. (U.S. Federal Census, Utah, p. 107, household #567.)

-The father William was the oldest of 10 children. In 1854 William was called on a mission to England. He ended up serving there 3 years and on his return he led a small company to Salt Lake. Among that company were two young women from England who helped care for his aunt. He later married both of them. (Our Pioneer Heritage, p.29, emailed)

-This family helped settle Bear Lake Valley with William's brother Franklin in 1864 and later, in 1881 moved to Flagstaff Arizona to be in charge of building the railroad. For the rest of his life William was in the merchandising business back in Utah. (Our Pioneer Heritage, p. 30, emailed)

-Adelia and William's marriage was one of the first conducted in the Nauvoo temple and was presided over by President Brigham Young. (<https://www.geni.com/people/William-Young/6000000000628871407>)

-The family settled St. Charles in Bear Lake Valley. When the family went to move William determined that Adelia's sons were old enough to care for her and so left her and her children in St. Charles. Adelia used her mother's loom to make cloth. She later moved to Montpelier where she ran a lodging house. (William Goodall Young, <https://www.geni.com/people/William-Young/6000000000628871407>)

-At one point, William worked as a herb doctor and horticulturist in Salt Lake. (William Goodall Young and Adelia Clark, <http://freepages.genealogy.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~ckph/youngwg.html>)

-Maria, from age 16 on, lived the rest of her life in St. Charles, Idaho. Her husband, George McKay Pugmire at age 6 was ordained as a high priest and pronounced a literal descendant of Aaron by Patriarch John Smith (Joseph Smith's Uncle). (George McKay Pugmire (1846-1910), as quoted in his father's autobiography, <http://freepages.genealogy.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~ckph/pugmiregm.html>)

-William Wallace, the couple's third child later married Annie Beers and together they had Claudia in 1878 in St. Charles, ID. (Idaho, Birth Index, 1861-1911, Entry for birth of Claudia Young, 1878.)

-Joseph Gardner Young married Alice Porter and they had 11 children together. After his wife Alice died Joseph eventually ended up in Ventura California where he died. (<http://www.findagrave.com/cgi-bin/fg.cgi?page=gr&GRid=67761763>).

-Lorenzo Dow III married Sarah Ann Sanderson and lived out his life in St. Charles, ID along with his older sister. (<http://www.findagrave.com/cgi-bin/fg.cgi?page=gr&GRid=35929287>) Sarah Ann Sanderson was born during her family's trek to Utah. The Indian's came by to see her the day after her birth. The chief asked her father, "how much?" Jokingly he responded, "100 horses."
