Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Levi was a member of the Mormon Battalion that traveled to California. In 1847, he returned from California. At some point he returned to the East to collect some of his family. Together, they returned to Utah in 1852. In this company, he served as captain of the 4th ten. The Hancock, Hunt, Pace, Lytle Company in 1847 was composed of 117 returning Mormon Battalion veterans. They traveled over the Sierra Mountains from the Cosumnes River near Sutter's Fort in California. From the beginning, they divided and traveled separately in small groups, but generally within a few day's distance from each other. After crossing the mountains, they followed a course which took them to Fort Hall and then to Salt Lake Valley.

Levi Hamilton McCullough was born on April 18, 1810 at Norwich, Chanango County, New York to Levi McCullough and Isabella Hamilton. Very little, if any, is known of his childhood. We know only that he met Clarinda Altonia Bartholomew and they were married on January 9, 1834. By 1838 they had moved to Jackson, Michigan. There he listened to the Mormon Missionaries, accepted the gospel and was baptized on April 21, 1845. When his father heard about it he became very angry and disowned his son. Records do not indicate that Clarinda was baptized during her lifetime, for she died a short time later. They had three children by the time he joined the Church. Their fourth and last child was born August 11, 1845, while still living in Michigan.
