Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? Family #268 in Nodaway, Andrew, Missouri.

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Came west with the Isaac M. Stewart in 1852. About 245 individuals and 53 wagons were in the company when it began its journey from the outfitting post at Kanessville, Iowa. Members of the company arrived in the Salt Lake Valley from 28 August - 22 September 1852.

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

Lorenzo served in the Mormon Battalion but was among those who departed from Pueblo and returned to Salt Lake City due to ill health. Lorenzo was the one who was kicked by a horse or mule and became infamous for being the only one injured from the Battalion. He reportedly suffered somewhat from the effects for many years afterward.
