Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? George and his first wife and children are living in Great Salt Lake County, house #393, p.95 (George D age 39, Elizabeth age 36, Thalia age 14, George age 12, William age 9, Josephine age 7, Dan C age 5, Julia age 2)

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Brigham Young Company, left from Winter Quarters June 5, 1848 and arrived Sep. 20-24, 1848.

-George D. Grant was given 30 acres at Brigham's Farm otherwise known as Summer Quarters in 1847. This was a generous portion since Brigham Young's adopted sons John Lee and Isaac Morley only got 75 and 15 acres respectively. The remaining 45 acres were divided among 20 people.
