Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

-The Joseph B Hart and Elizabeth Hart family found in Wayne County Iowa may be Harriet Hart's family. Their oldest child is named Clarissa R, which was Harriet's mother's name. Further, Clarissa and Argin ages 7 and 5 were born in Missouri which is where the saints were during those years. Additionally, there is a three-year gap between the two youngest children, Argin and John where Harriet could have been born in. The next census page shows Truman and Clarissa who are likely Joseph's parents as they are 69 and 68 years old. Elisha Hart is the next head of family and was also born in Virginia (like Joseph) so is almost certainly a brother. It looks like Elisha is one year older than Joseph.

-A Joseph Hart is mentioned in Highland Grove Branch in Iowa in 1848.
