Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? Great Salt Lake County, house #580: David age 34, Beulah age 24, David age 7, Mary Ann age 5, William age 1.

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? David went with the 1847 Brigham Young Company which left the Platt River April 16, 1847 and arrived July 21. He returned in 1848 and again traveled with the Brigham Young Company which left Winter Quarters June 5, 1848 and arrived Sep. 20-24. He brought his two children with him in the 1848 Company.

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

-Before her marriage to David Mary Ann was married to Isaac Bullard on May 31, 1841 or on March 31, by Heber C. Kimball in Adams Illinois. She then married David Grant on Sep. 18, 1843 in Nauvoo. Hyrum Smith performed the second ceremony. (emailed info page) (Nauvoo Civil Marriages, p. 39)

-Mary Ann and David had David William on Aug. 21, 1844 in Nauvoo and Mary Ann on July 8, 1846 in Iowa. (Information sheet, emailed, p. 952)

-Her daughter Mary Ann married Willard Lorenzo Snow but died Dec. 13, 1863 when she was only 17-years-old. (Family Group Record, Sep. 8, 2004)

-Hyde Park Utah in Cache County was named after Mary Ann's brother William Hyde. (Mary Ann Hyde, by: Joan Tolman Fuller, P.O. Box 403 Fort Benton, Montana 59442)

-Mary Ann's family first learned of the church when their neighbor Warren Cowdery, Oliver Cowdery's brother, was given some proof sheets of the Book of Mormon. Two to three years later missionaries visited the area. First Mary Ann's father and brother William joined the church and soon after her whole family followed. (Mary Ann Hyde, by: Joan Tolman Fuller, P.O. Box 403 Fort Benton, Montana 59442)

-Mary Ann was only married a year and a half before her first husband died. (Mary Ann Hyde, by: Joan Tolman Fuller, P.O. Box 403 Fort Benton, Montana 59442)

-David served just over 3 years on a mission to England from 1853-1856.

-David later married Beulah Chipman but she only lived for three years after their marriage. Mary Jane Hunsaker was his third wife. (<https://www.geni.com/people/David-Grant/6000000010431176869>)

-David became a tailor at age 19. For the rest of his life he tailored, especially for Brigham Young. He grew up in Scotland but later moved to America to be with his brother Robert. Later in life he wrote inspiring verse. (<https://www.geni.com/people/David-Grant/6000000010431176869>)

-David William Grant married Martha Melvina and had George Molen. He lived much of his life in Hyde Park where he eventually died over the age of 70. (<https://www.geni.com/people/David-Grant/6000000018109604392>)
