-Johanna was baptized in 1843. (emailed info sheet)

-Lauren and Johanna were married Oct. 16, 1842 in Nauvoo, Illinois. (emailed info sheet) John Taylor performed the ceremony. (Renée R. Munteer,

-Together Lauren and Johanna had Byron Donalvin and William Heber. Both boys made it to Utah. (<https://winterquarters.byu.edu/portals/121//PAF/ward5/pafg08.htm#277>)

-Johanna had been very close with one of her sisters who died before her. Just after the birth of her first son her deceased sister appeared to Johanna and told her she was going to take her to the other side. Johanna begged for more time with her family. Just after the birth of Johanna's second son her sister again appeared and said she needed to come this time and then disappeared. Shortly after this second appearance Johanna died. -Upon moving to Utah Byron was mostly raised by his grandparents Betsy and Shadrach Roundy. He went on to ride for the Utah Pony Express several times. He lived in St. George and Kanab. He made five different trips across the plains with emigrants coming to Utah. He ended up marrying and farming in Kanab. (La Preal Snelson Friel, <https://familysearch.org/photos/artifacts/5179611>)

-William, the second son, worked at a mine in Pioche, Nevada. Eventually he settled near his brother in Kanab where he raised sheep and farmed. (La Preal Snelson Friel, <https://familysearch.org/photos/artifacts/5179611>)

-Lauren married Jane Ann Koyle from Canada as his second wife once he came to Utah. She too died when she was young. Eventually Lauren married for a third time to Martha Edmundson who already had three children. (La Preal Snelson Friel, <https://familysearch.org/photos/artifacts/5179611>); (1850 U.S. Census, Utah, Davis County, House #152)

-Lauren had a 160-acre farm in Springville, UT. Here he raised thoroughbred horses, cattle, fruit trees, sugar cane, and grain. He also built a two-story adobe house on the property. (La Preal Snelson Friel, <https://familysearch.org/photos/artifacts/5179611>)

-At age 85 Lauren died of the cancer that had slowly been taking his eye sight. (La Preal Snelson Friel, <https://familysearch.org/photos/artifacts/5179611>)
