Which Winter Quarters Ward or Iowa Branch was the family: 1st ward

Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? The three children were living with their grandmother Edith Davis in Montrose, Iowa, house # 104, p. 395.

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Isaac and Elisha Hyrum came with the David Cannon Company left Florence, Nebraska June 1, 1861 and arrived Aug. 11-16, 1861.

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

-Isaac and Sabina were married June 17, 1837 in Lisbon, Ohio. (Family Group Sheet, emailed) Sabina would have been 18 years old.

-Together Sabina and Isaac had three children: Elisha Hyrum born April 3, 1841 in Montrose Iowa; Lorenzo Barnes born July 16, 1843 also in Montrose, Iowa; and Arcina Jane born Dec. 18, 1846 in Council Bluffs, Iowa. (emailed sheet, p.524)

-Sabina was baptized April 8, 1838. (emailed sheet, p. 524)

-Isaac joined the Mormon Battalion and was in California when Sabina died. His mother in law took care of his children. Isaac met and married Catherine in San Francisco on Feb. 4, 1849.

Catherine was from Scotland. She and her husband joined the church in 1845. They sailed to San Francisco and from there planned to reach Utah. Her husband died shortly after arriving in San Francisco and a month later Catherine gave birth. Isaac and Catherine lived in California for another 10 years until they moved to Holiday, Utah in 1857.

-Arcina never made it to Utah. She married Joshua T Blackstone and by 1880 had moved to Nebraska with him. (1880, U.S. Census, Riverside, Burt, Nebraska, sheet 360 B, vol 1)

-Lorenzo also never came to Utah. He served in the armed forces and at age 59 died and was buried in Montrose, Iowa. (Lorenzo B. Harrison, Iowa, Armed Forces Grave Registrations, ca 1835-1998)

-Elisha Hyrum died in 1861 on the trek to Utah. His father had come back for him, but he died from bleeding on his brain. (Almira Jane Reid Hall, Autobiography, p.46-59, <https://history.lds.org/overlandtravel/sources/4947/hall-almira-jane-reid-autobiography-46-59>)
