-Amos and Mary Ann were both born in Fort Ann, Washington, New York. Together they had Benjamin A, James H, and Cirvillia Jane.

-Benjamin and Cervilia Jane both died at Winter Quarters in March and February respectively. (Andrew Jenson, The Tragedy at Winter Quarters, p. 5.)

-After Amos' death in 1851 Mary Ann remarried to Lucian Clark in Wisconsin. Lucian had left his wife Lucy and already had three children. (<http://www.findagrave.com/cgi-bin/fg.cgi?page=gr&GRid=82455049>)

-Mary Ann died Jan. 2, 1894 and was buried in Albion, Boone County, Nebraska.
