Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Willard Richards Company left Winter Quarters, Nebraska July 3, 1848 and arrived Oct. 10, 1848

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

-Patty was born in Columbia, New York.

-She had a little brother Collins Rowe and a little sister Harriet Jenette who were still living with their parents in 1850.

-Weeden is listed as a shoemaker in the 1850 census.

-Sarah was Patty's sister and was four years older. She married Daniel Porter Clark in Nauvoo on Aug. 31, 1845. Only Sarah, Collins, and Harriet lived to old age out of the eight children. (Modified Register)

-Patty's next oldest sister, Alvis Ann, died the same year as her, 1846.

- After moving to Utah the family was asked to help settle San Bernardino, California. Susan, Patty's sister just younger than her died here in 1856. (Modified Register)

-Patty was sealed to her brother-in-law as his third wife 24 years after her death. (J.C. Lillywhite letter, 18 July 2004.)
