Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Jedediah M. Grant – Joseph B. Noble Company. John Angus drove a wagon for Brigham Young. They left from Kanesville June 19, 1847 and arrived Oct. 2, 1847.

-He was born in Sterling Scotland.

-John Orson Angus, his son, served a mission to Kentucky and England. He returned home from his mission in England with a wife, Elizabeth Patrick. (<https://history.lds.org/missionary/individual/john-orson-angus-1812>)

-John's mission to Kentucky was to canvas for the Prophet Joseph Smith's candidacy for United States President in 1844. ("Died," Deseret News, 6 Oct. 1880, 576.)

-William left England with his son John in 1842 for Nauvoo, Ill. They were baptized in 1840. ("Died," Deseret News, 6 Oct. 1880, 576.)

-In 1860 he and his wife Elizabeth were living in Salt Lake and he was farming (U.S. Census 1860, house #245, p. 256.)

-John was called to settle St. George in 1861 and by 1870 he is farming there and doing quite well. ("Died," Deseret News, 6 Oct. 1880, 576.); (1870 U.S. Census, house #158, p. 24.)
